

What goes into your recycling container:

Please recycle;

-Dry food boxes, packaging, paper bags, cardboard, white paper, colored paper, letters and junk mail, shredded paper in a see-through bag

-Milk cartons and juice boxes

-Magazines, newspapers, catalogs, phone books

-Block Styrofoam often in electronic and appliance packaging (No Styrofoam peanuts or sheets)

-Empty metal paint or aerosol cans

-Glass or plastic bottles and jars, plus all CRV containers

-Steel, tin, pie tins, wire hangers, aluminum cans, foil, plus all CRV containers

Recycling Information

Dry food boxes, packaging, paper bags, cardboard, white paper, colored paper, letters and junk mail

Milk cartons and juice boxes

Magazines, newspapers, catalogs, phone books

Empty metal paint or aerosol cans

Often in electronic or appliance packaging (NO Peanut or packing Styrofoam)

Glass or plastic bottles and jars, plus all CRV containers

Shredded paper in a clear see through bag

Steel, tin, pie tins, wire hangers, aluminum cans, foil, plus all CRV containers
