Brawley City Council Meeting Highlights – February 3, 2026

Brawley, CA — The Brawley City Council convened for its regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday, February 3, 2026, to receive updates on public safety practices and capital projects, approve new employee recognition initiatives, and make appointments to City boards and commissions. The following is a summary of major actions and announcements from the meeting:

Council Approvals and Actions

- The City Council approved an Employee of the Month Recognition Policy and adopted a resolution formally establishing the program and its associated incentives. The program is designed to recognize outstanding employee performance, promote morale, and highlight excellence in public service across City departments.
- The City Council authorized an agreement with a qualified contractor to complete an update to the City's Urban Water Management Plan (UWMP) and authorized the City Manager to execute all documentation related to the Agreement. The UWMP update is a required planning document that supports long-term water supply reliability and compliance with state regulations.
- The City Council approved the Mayor's appointments and reappointments to the City's Boards, Commissions, and Committees that require City Council representation. These appointments help ensure effective communication between the City Council and advisory bodies, and support the ongoing operations, oversight, and policy development of City programs and services. Appointments are generally made annually or as needed due to term expirations, vacancies, or changes in Council assignments.

Reports and Informational Items

- The Council received a presentation outlining the Brawley Police Department's current vehicle towing and impoundment procedures. The presentation was provided as part of an effort to increase transparency and public understanding of existing practices related to vehicle enforcement and impoundment.
- An update was provided on the Lion's Center Pool construction project. Construction continues to move forward and remains on schedule. Recently, crews installed new pool plumbing, completed underground work, and prepared

the ground that will support the new pool structure. Currently, work is focused on preparing the pool foundation and installing steel reinforcement for the pool floor, walls, and deck. The project remains on track and is anticipated to be completed in Spring 2026.

The Brawley City Council remains committed to transparency, employee recognition, public safety awareness, and continued investment in community facilities that enhance quality of life for residents.
