Brawley City Council Meeting Highlights – November 4, 2025

Brawley, CA — The Brawley City Council convened for its regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday, November 4, 2025, to consider several key policy updates, community initiatives, and event approvals designed to enhance city operations and strengthen community engagement. The following is a summary of major actions and announcements from the meeting:

Council Approvals and Actions

- The Council approved the second reading and formally adopted an ordinance establishing a Vacant Building Registration Program to assist with code enforcement efforts. The new program is intended to promote property maintenance, address blight, and encourage the productive reuse of vacant structures throughout the community, aligning with the Council's goals for community improvement and code enforcement. This ordinance was last updated in 1996.
- Council received the Year-End Budget Report for Fiscal Year 2024/25, summarizing revenues and expenditures for the period of July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025. The report included analysis of notable variances from the final adopted budget and an update on final carryovers from FY 2024/25 to FY 2025/26, reflecting the City's ongoing commitment to transparent and responsible fiscal management.
- Approval was granted for Cattle Call Family Night, a community celebration organized by Inferno, which includes a temporary road closure on North Plaza Street, between Main Street and Fifth Street. The event will take place on Thursday, November 6, 2025, from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. and will feature family-friendly activities in support of the annual Cattle Call festivities.
- The Council approved a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City of Brawley and the Brawley Elementary School District to launch a youth soccer program under the MLS GO model. The program will be implemented through the district's Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELOP) and aims to expand extracurricular opportunities for local youth while strengthening community relations through mentorship by law enforcement officers serving as coaches.

- Council authorized two new personnel allocations within the Brawley Fire Department, including one full-time firefighter and one limited-term firefighter position, to support operational readiness and improve response capacity.

Announcements

- The City announced the upcoming Veterans Day Ceremony, held in collaboration with the Elks Lodge and Hidalgo Society, on Tuesday, November 11, 2025, at the Memorial Wall, beginning at 10:00 a.m. The public is warmly invited to attend and join in honoring local veterans for their service and sacrifice.

The Brawley City Council remains dedicated to transparent governance, fiscal stewardship, and fostering a strong sense of community pride and participation.
