Proposition 218 Notification NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS OF PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED WATER AND SEWER RATES

Why are you receiving this notice?

This notice is being furnished to you by the City of Brawley pursuant to the California Constitution Article XIIID (also knows as "Proposition 218"). Under terms of Proposition 218, the City is required to notify property owners of proposed changes to property-related fees such as water and sewer service. This letter serves as notice that the City will hold a public hearing on September 1, 2009, to consider changes to its current water and sewer rates.

What do water and sewer rates fund? The City provides water and sewer service to over 5,000 customers (residential and commercial) within the city limits. Both utilities must be financially self-sufficient. Monthly rates paid by users of the system are the primary source of revenue.

All revenue generated from your utility bills is used to maintain and operate the water and sewer systems; it is not used for other general government purposes. These revenues must meet costs such as purchasing raw water, electricity, chemicals, maintenance, and salaries and benefits for utility enterprise staff. Additionally, revenue generated from these rates is used to pay off debt incurred in the process of building capital improvements for each system.

Why are the rate changes required? The City recently completed an analysis of the capital project requirements of the two utilities. Both water and sewer utilities require extensive investment, primarily in the replacement and repair of aging pipes and other equipment, in order to maintain a safe and reliable system. These replacements will be funded primarily with rate revenues, and also by loans, and fees paid by new development connecting to the system. In addition, the rates included in this notice are required as part of the terms of the loan agreement with the state to fund improvements to the wastewater treatment plant.

New water rates In 2008 the City moved residential customers to a metered water rate structure, meaning customers are now billed—in part—on how much water they consume. Under the proposed rates, the fixed portion of your bill (currently \$35.23 per month for a single family residence) will not change. The charge for water consumption will increase in two stages, starting September 15th 2009, and again in September of 2010. Table 1 on the back of this notice details the proposed rate changes.

New sewer rates The sewer utility bills all customers a fixed monthly charge based on estimated flow to the sewer system. Under the proposed changes, the sewer rates will increase in four phases over the next four years. Table 2 details the proposed rate changes.

Impact on your bill For a typical single family home that uses 19,000 gallons of water per month, the water portion of your bill would increase from \$47.20 per month currently to \$61.26 per month under the new rates. Low users of water and users who conserve water from their current levels will see smaller increases. The monthly sewer bill for a single family home will increase by about \$4.30 per month in October of 2009, and by a similar amount for each of the two years after.

How do you protest? Water and sewer rates are subject to majority protest, which means if a majority of impacted property owners (or renters if they are financially responsible for the bill) submit written protests against the increase, the City cannot institute the new rates. To protest, include your name, the address of the impacted property (or APN number) and your signature. Written protests are accepted by mail to the City Clerk or in person at the public hearing on the date and time specified above.
